

What is Mountain Haven ?

A program which provides shelter and services to youth ages 12 to 17 years old who are runaway and/or homeless.

What do we provide?

-A safe, secure shelter with supervision and supports available 24 hours a day.

-Life skill training and linkage to community supports to encourage increased independence and opportunities for community inclusion (i.e., healthcare ,employment, educational and vocational supports, mental health resources, spirituality preferences and recreational / leisure activities).

-Mental Health Services which includes individual counseling (including substance abuse, as identified as a risk), and Psycho-Educational Group Counseling. Youth may also see a community psychiatrist, and will be required to do so for management of any prescribed psychotropic medications.

-A program structure which supports their success in community living and personal development/ growth.

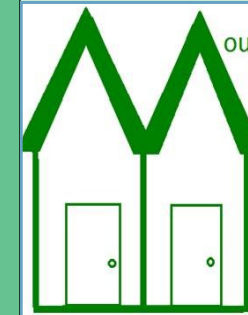
Vision

“To provide youth temporary shelter and necessary supports to be safe, limit academic disruption, receive medical care, and have meaningful engagement in their community, practice skills / abilities and/or to promote long term independence and autonomy, and develop healthy relationships and a community support system while working on permanency plan.”

Program Criteria

- Participants must be ages 12-17 years old
- Homeless or runaway
- Voluntary Agreement to participate in program services.
- Willingness to complete program.
- Enrollment in educational program.
- Participate in weekly counseling.

What is the referral Process?

- Contact Mountain Haven at (606) 784-3337 or come to program at 1034 E Main St (beside St. Claire Outpatient Clinic on the bypass/ East US 60).
- Complete the referral and intake, assessment forms.
- We need to notify parent/ guardian to notify them youth is safe and secure permission.
- Youth and guardian, if available, will participate in initial intake and assessment .
- If initial assessment indicates need, youth will be taken for immediate medical and or behavioral health evaluation .
